

# **Kingdom Values: Lent Calendar of Kindness Secondary School Version**

Traditionally, calendars are only for Advent, but we are introducing a Calendar of Kindness for use during the season of Lent. Because Lent starts on the Wednesday during half term, we have started this calendar from the first day back after half term with the story of Jesus in the desert. The calendar elements link with the theme of Kingdom

Values and also cover some of the events of Jesus' ministry & life over the 3 years between Jesus' temptation and his Resurrection. On the following pages we have set out the planned content for each day, so that you can plan ahead.

The calendar will go live at 00:01 on February 22<sup>nd</sup> and each door will only open on the correct day.

#### In the calendar, you will find:

- an image;

  - the Bible reference for the day;
  - a video link. Some days we have included a link to a YouTube video relevant to the theme;
- some thoughts for you to ponder and a prompt for an act of kindness (in **bold**).
- Each day, you could also consider the following questions: How was Jesus an 'agent of change' here? How did other people view Jesus' actions? How do you think people reacted to hearing Jesus' words? Why might Jesus have said / done this....? What does this story mean for me?

## Theme: Being an 'agent of change' during Lent

<b>Day 7</b> 28/2	Jesus chooses Matthew	Luke 5: 27-32	Picture: exclamation marks from Pixabay	Matthew did a surprising thing in following Jesus. Jesus did a surprising thing by choosing him. Do a surprising thing (in a good way!) for someone else today.

#### Theme: How do we show what we 'value'?

Day 16 9/3	Jesus' feet are washed	Luke 7: 36-50	Picture of muddy feet Pixabay	What did this woman do to show how much she valued Jesus? Do something for the people you value today.
Day 17 10/3	The Kingdom parables	Matthew 13	Picture poppy in a field Pixabay	What does this show about the important things in God's kingdom? Choose to do what is good and right today.
Day 18 11/3	Lost – and found!	Find connections with any of the 'Lost' parables in Luke 15	Picture child looking Pixabay	Can you find connections with any of the 'Lost' parables? How did Jesus show value for the lost? Who might be the 'lost' people in your school / community? Show someone who's lonely that you value them today.
Day 19 12/3	Feeding the 5000	John 6:1-13	Picture Feeding of 5,000 from The Methodist Modern Art Collection	Jesus values a little boy's lunch. What 'little' could you offer to God, or to someone else today?

## Lent: week 4 (15<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> March)

## Theme: Jesus is God in human form

This week, we take a slightly different focus on the mysterious Christian idea of the Trinity, to fit in with St. Patrick's Day, using some stories from Jesus' life – starting with his baptism.

Day 22 15/3	Jesus' baptism	Mark 1:9-11	Picture of water from Pixabay	<ul> <li>We go back to the beginning of Jesus' ministry to look for signs of the Trinity as Jesus is baptised.</li> <li>Can you find God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in the story?</li> </ul>
Day 23 16/3	Calming the storm	Luke 8	Storm at sea photo from Pixabay	How does Jesus show he is God here? Bring 'calm' to someone's storm today. You might like to ask God to help you.
Day 24 17/3	St. Patrick's Day	Patrick's own parable	Shamrock photo from Pixabay	Today is St Patrick's Day Watch the video about St Patrick and the Shamrock. How does Patrick's illustration and his life show what God is like? Be inspired by St. Patrick's actions in what you do today.
Day 25 18/3	Bless you!	2 Corinthians 13:14 Trinity blessing	Trinity photo from Pixabay May the grace [Lyric Video] - YouTube	Read 2 Corinthians 13:14 The Trinity blessing"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us all."These words are often spoken as a blessing. Listen to the words of the song.How many times did you hear the three 'persons' in the Trinity mentioned?Act in ways that show grace, love and friendship today.
Day 26 19/3	Walking on water	Matthew 14: 24-33	Tightrope walking Pixabay	How does Jesus show he is God here? What did Peter learn about following Jesus in this story? Peter tried to do what Jesus did. Be a good example for someone else to follow.
Day 27 20/3	The Transfiguration	Mark 9: 21-28	Mountain photo from Pixabay	What does this story show about Jesus?What questions do you think the disciples asked?The friends saw Jesus in a different way today.They also heard God's voice.Either:Ask that you will hear God's voice today.Try to see someone else differently today.
Day 28 21/3	Jesus' Prayer	Luke 11	Praying hands photo from Pixabay	Even though he was God, Jesus still prayed, and taught his friends to pray too. This is the story of prayer that Jesus taught that Christians call the Lord's Prayer. Why do you think Jesus taught his disciples this prayer? Why do you think Christians still pray it? Take a moment to pray today if you'd like to.
