RESERVED TEACHERS

Section 58 of the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 requires the appointment in voluntary controlled (VC)/foundation schools, and academies that have converted from such schools, of teachers who are able to provide religious education in accordance with the requirements of the Trust Deed of the school or in accordance with the tenets of the relevant religion or denomination.

Academies

An academy that has converted from VC status also has the duty to ensure there are at least 2 reserved teachers.

What is a 'reserved teacher'?

Where the number of teachers at a foundation or voluntarycontrolled school with a religious character is more than two, the teachers must include persons who are selected for their fitness and competence to teach religious education in accordance with the school's trust deed or with the tenets of the school's religion and are specifically appointed to do so. These individuals must be qualified teachers and not other members of staff.

What is 'denominational RE'?

There is no explicit definition of denominational religious education but in practice it means any religious education provided in accordance with the requirements of the Trust Deed of the school and that is not the Locally Agreed Syllabus. This might mean RE taught from the perspective of the Anglican faith or RE that meets the stated expectations of the Church of **England Education Office.**

Parents

Parents and guardians are entitled to request denominational RE for their children.

Proportion

Federations

In federations, it is acceptable to have 2 reserved teachers across the federation.

It is the responsibility of foundation governors to approve the

appointment (and dismissal) of reserved teachers; they must ensure there are at least 2 reserved teachers.
